I. Project Activity Update

Floor Repairing - Completed

Casting of floors in all the five classrooms has been completed. In this process

- a) the old, damaged floor was removed
- b) new floor was casted with cement ratio of 4:1 for enhancing durability.



Classroom Painting - Completed

The painting work for all classrooms has been completed. Glossy emulsion paint has been used to make the classrooms brighter. The doors and windows have also been painted.



Procurement of Televisions – <u>Completed</u>

All the classes have been fitted with smart televisions. To prevent any incidence of damage, television screen protectors with wooden frames and toughened glass have been placed on these televisions.

New Furniture and Cupboards for Classrooms – In process

- Steel cupboards, are now placed in the classroom. The steel almirahs are more durable than the wooden cupboards. The teachers now have a safe place for storing project and other teaching materials.
- Soft Boards will also be placed in the classrooms.
- For the class furniture, PYDS is on the lookout for a new supplier: the consultation with another supplier did not materialize.



Phones - On hold

As the school is currently closed for physical attendance due to Omicron case surge, the mobile
phones have not yet been ordered. This shall be done when physical classes resume and the use of
these phones is integrated into the curriculum.

II. General Organisation Updates

1. Bringing colors back to campus – resumption of a vibrant campus life



Morning Assembly

September 2021, saw the PYDS campus opening up in a phased manner. By the end of the month all students from Grades 6-12 were back. In October 2021, the students of Grades 4 and 5 returned to the campus after almost two years.

Till November 2021, as per government guidelines, classes were held for only 4 hours each day. The rest of the time was used by teachers to identify learning gaps, modify lesson plans, implement assessment of any knowledge and skill erosion that took place during the lockdown, and work on students' verbal articulation and conceptual understanding.

Since December, the school has resumed normal scheduling of scholastic and co-scholastic activities, which means that all students from classes 4 to 12 are in school from 8:30 am - 4:30 pm.

January 2022, saw another period of school closure with the spread of Omicron. As the situation came back into control, Grades 10 to 12 had already returned on 31 January 2022. Beginning February 2022, the Uttarakhand Government permitted the reopening of Schools from Grades 1 to 12. On the 7th Feb, PYDS welcomed back students of Grades 1-3. **Grades 1 and 2 were coming to School for the first time in their lives!** The children were welcomed into renovated and whitewashed classrooms, equipped with a television and a vibrant learning environment - all sponsored by ERI and ASED. The campus lit up with their chit chats and chuckles. They were ecstatic and had thousands of stories to tell their friends. The PYDS spirit was reignited! 2. School Activities

Juxtaposing with the harsh winter, campus activities were on in full swing ever since the students returned to school.

Digital Citizenship Curriculum

With the increased integration of online sources and distribution of mobile devices, the teachers observed that the students were becoming more susceptible to the negative side effects of digital integration. One of this was an increasing exposure to social media, which has begun to heavily influence their views of the world. This has led to a host of distortions and loss of focus in their minds.

To address this, Principal, Mrs. Arati Nagaraj devised a curriculum around Digital Citizenship. The intent of this effort is to encourage students to become good digital citizens and develop a common approach and attitude towards digital devices and social media. Sessions under the curriculum began in December for

Grades IV-XI. These sessions have been engaging and self-reflective.

Distribution of Winter Clothing

Dehradun is one of the frostiest cities in India with an average minimum temperature of 6 degrees Celsius. As the yearly bone-chilling winter covers the whole city in its canopy, puffer jackets were distributed to all students. These jackets



come with an insulated section stitched inside to give an additional layer of warmth.

Christmas Celebrations

With inspiring enthusiasm, the students made beautiful Christmas decorations from waste cardboard. What made it even more special was that the celebration featured children from the Navjeevan Program, who have recently joined mainstream education and are still being assimilated into the PYDS community. Students and



staff sang Christmas carols, spent merry times and captured lots of photographs.

Sania Khan is the topper of her batch in the Bachelor of Physiotherapy program at Swami Rama Himalayan University (SRHU) in Dehradun.

Her mother suffered from Edema (body fluid accommodation) since Sania's childhood. Well aware that she is the only hope for her family and desirous of helping other people, Sania opted for and secured admission in the four-year Bachelor of Physiotherapy program in SRHU in 2017.
